##### **1. Brief History of the Organization**

Our main focus is to empower the marginalized underprivileged, downtrodden neglected and alienated community by building up their own capacity and resources through education and skill development. Depending upon the prevailing existing conditions and community needs and demands selected pockets/ project areas of Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Bihar & Uttar Pradesh are being covered. Educational programmes for the weaker sections especially women and out of school girls. It's '**An Attempt Towards Social Equality and Justice**' for those who really need and deserve.

### **C. Administrative & Operational Mechanism**

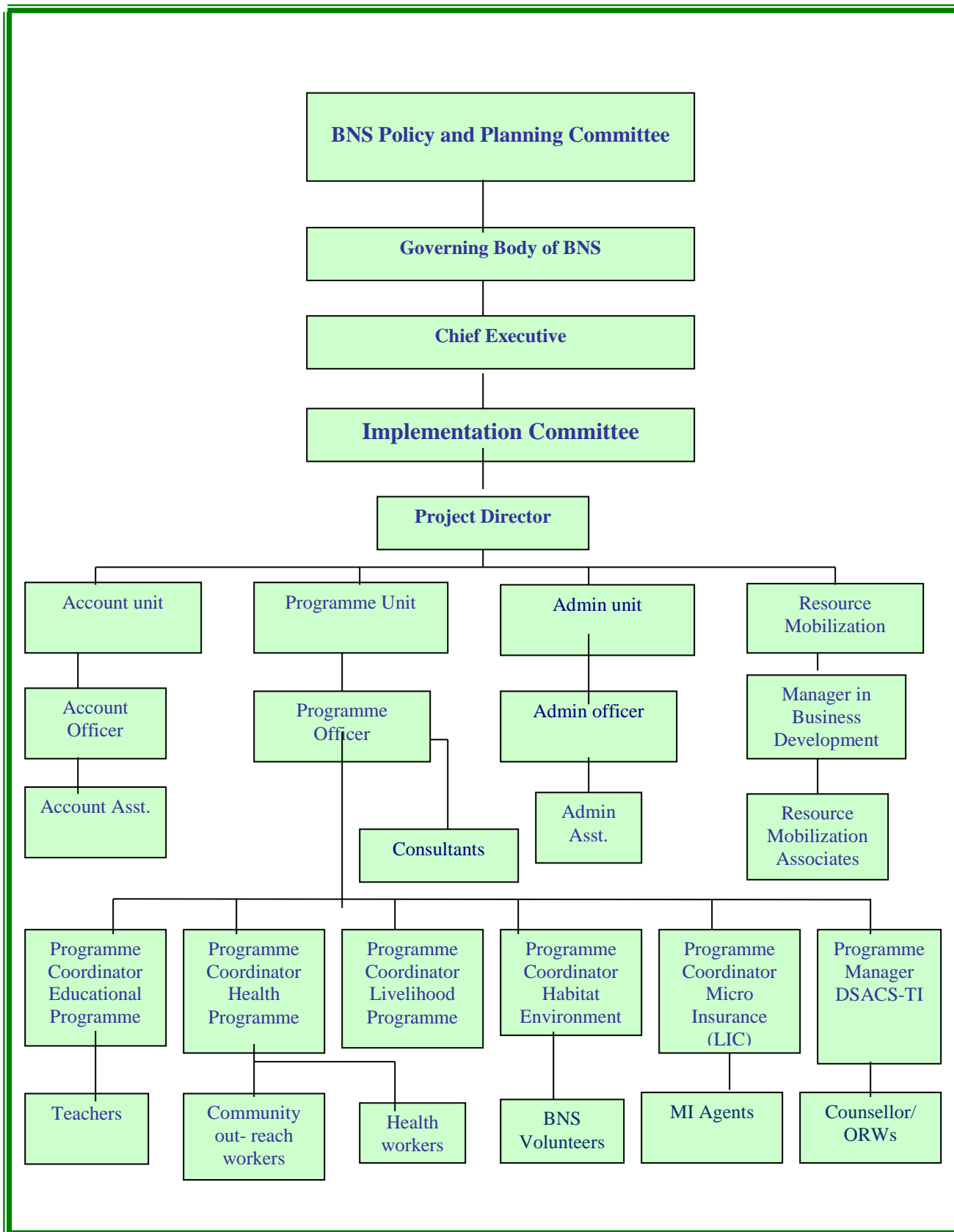
Bhartiya Navdeep Samiti operates under a network of a Governing Body having main administrative office in New Delhi. The Governing Board consists of 11 members who are passionate social workers with 2 female and 9 male members who have vast grass root experience in urban & rural development sector. Above the Governing Body there is a General Body which consists of 17 members. This is the supreme body which forms Governing Body. The meeting of the Governing Body is held twice in a year and General Body is held once in a year as well as according to the requirement the meeting can be convened again.

The Governing Board provides an overall supervision to BNS activities. It also monitors and manages the financial developmental and planning elements of both current and prospective projects. The Chief Executive of the organization oversees the functions of the organization and is held accountable to the Board. The Chief Executive of the organization takes all major decisions subject to the approval and ratification of Board. Individual projects are assigned to various in-charges (Fig. 1 Organizational Structure-BNS}

BNS has been involved directly at grass root level with rural and urban community, having a team of 32 full time & 50 part time staff and 15 consultants/resource persons and 20 volunteers. The staff, senior management includes social workers, professionals, social scientists, finance and administration personal, planners, educationists and Medical Professionals. Consultants do provide us necessary inputs on specific assignments and requirements.

## D. Project Profile – Activities:

The BNS has experience of 10 years of working in a very challenging and difficult environmental conditions and managing the resources available in an efficient and prudent way, even then achieving the goals set under a project making the BNS capable enough to handle any project for the betterment of the society both rural as well as urban which has been amply demonstrated and appreciated by the funding agencies both Govt. & Non-Govt.

The BNS which successfully accomplished various projects in the following areas of special interventions, namely!

## Educational Interventions:



Since its inception, the BNS has been working for the educational upliftment of children of weaker sections and down trodden by providing opportunities of mainstreaming all such children who has either never been to school or dropped outs through a number of multifaceted initiatives. It has been running

**Education Centres, Balwaris, Coaching Classes, Spoken English Programme, BPP (IGNOU), Workers Education Programmes** etc. sponsored by Govt, Non-Govt & Corporate organizations catering to thousands of beneficiaries (please see Table-I).



## Community Health Programmes:



The BNS has made remarkable success in handling projects of health awareness especially focusing on RCH & HIV related issues in addition to ANC, PNC. It has resulted in institutionalization of health awareness programmes and linkages with professionals, local PHCs & similar bodies.



The local populace by and large attend **Health Awareness Camps, routine Health Checkups, weekly OPD, RTI & STI camps, HIV / AIDS Prevention & Cure, Deaddiction Campaign, Dental & Eye Checkup Camps, Sex Education** for adolescents thus making people aware of all what is needed. More than 4000 community members have been benefited. In addition to it **Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana Enrollment Centre & Nutrition Demonstration & Distribution camps** for Adolescent Girls, Pregnant & Lactating Mothers and elderly community members has also been organized by the organization.



### Income Generation Programmes and Vocational Skill Development:



The BNS runs various income generation and skill development programmes mainly training in **cutting and tailoring, dress designing, beauty-culture, computer, art and craft, candle making, knitting & weaving and embroidery etc.** These skill development activities are in demand which have not only helped them for economic upliftment but their life styles too. They are also provided **Micro Insurance, Micro Finance**, and exposures to workers educations for working women and working children. These activities are benefiting approximately 700 persons of the weaker sections.

The BNS has been instrumental in the formation of 28 Self Help Group (**SHGs**) for women in Shakurpur areas covering approximately 400 such women. They have been provided technical know-how about savings, inter loaning and entrepreneurial skills alongwith literacy, exposure to socio-legal and health awareness issues etc. In this way 300 families have been covered.



### Legal Awareness Camps & Counselling Activities :

The BNS provides legal awareness and counselling facilities with the help of a team of legal experts comprising of practicing advocates and law students. Domestic Violence and matrimonial discords are tackled and settled amicably through counseling. Efforts are made to solve all such disputes through negotiation,





conciliation and “pramarsh” (face to face involvement of parties) at the BNS office once a week. General legal awareness camps are also organized in the community. So far 200 persons are benefited individually through individual counseling and 800 through group counseling/ awareness camps.

**Other Community Development Activities :**

The BNS has been participating and organizing following activities time to time on demand and need of the community :

- Disaster Management - Awareness Programmes on fire fighting, earth quake, flood, drought etc.;
- Solid Waste Management Programme
- Anti plastic campaign & promotion of jute bags;
- Awareness Programme Water Conservation, Energy Conservation etc.;
- Awareness programmes for the registration on birth, disability and construction worker;
- Awareness & Facilitation of Social welfare Schemes (Old age, widow, disability, ladli yojana, BPL Card etc.);
- Organizing Enrollment Centre for Construction Workers, RBY, UID (AADHAR) etc.

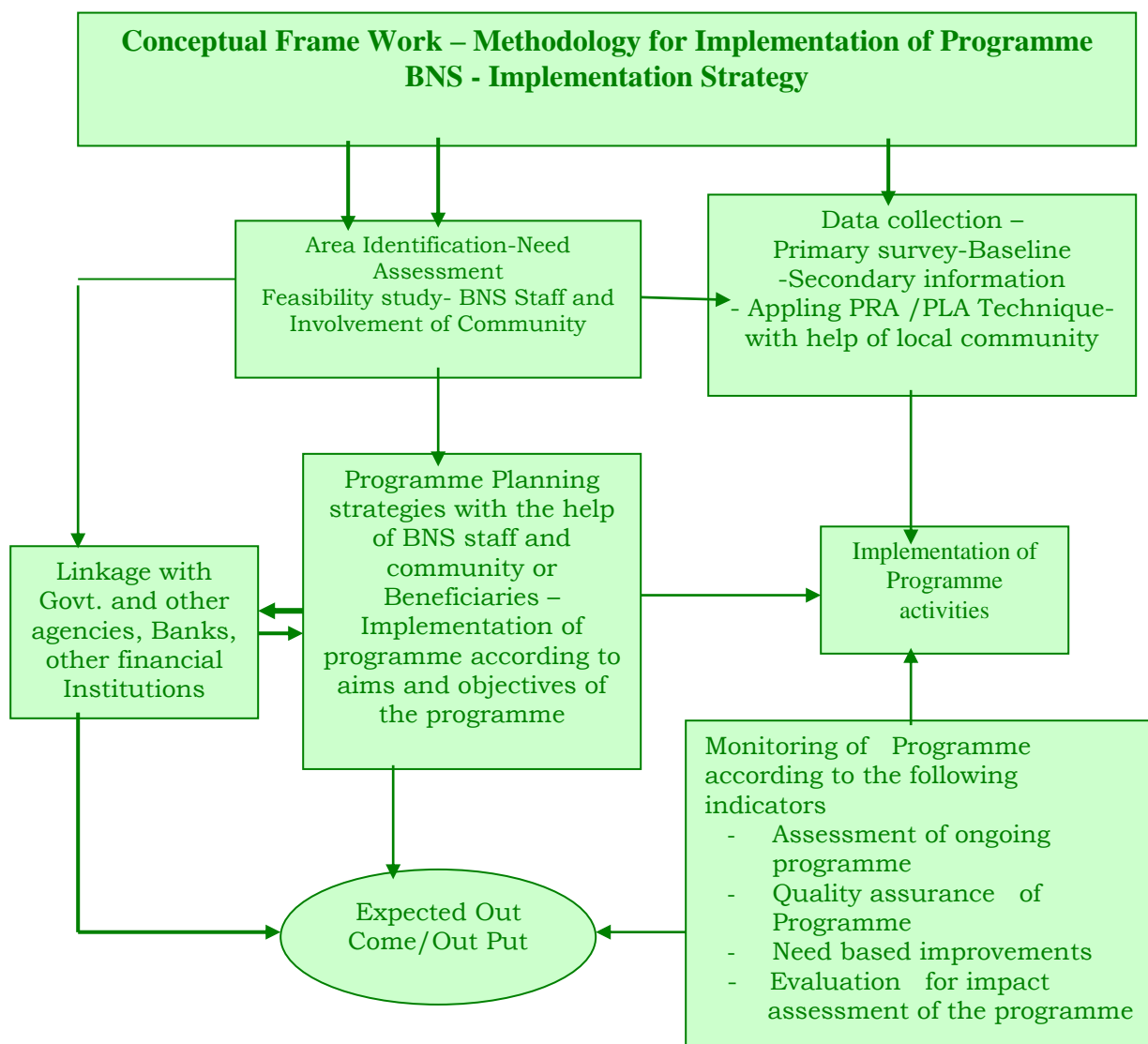
